- Ensure Hart Hill has endorsed my Fossicking Permit
- Respectfully pan, sift and detect
- Access any area on the property foot traffic only
- Shut gates
- Fill in my diggings
- Leave the dirt and water in the creek
- Ensure I have appropriate health and safety protection boots, sun-cream, hat etc.

### I won't;

- Use a sluice
- High bank
- Dig into the creek walls where it would undermine the bank and its vegetation
- Take dirt or water out of the creek
- Enter neighbouring properties only keeping to the creek bed or Hart Hill side.






# Fossicking around Thane

#### Thanes Creek Gold Prospecting Area (GPA)

Turn **left** out of Hart Hill Camping; take the next left and continue down Big Hill Road towards Pratten; over the cattle grid on the left is the GPA (1.5km).





#### **Talgia State Forest**

Continue down Big Hill Road towards Pratten (5.6km). There is debate whether Queenslands' biggest nugget came from Gympie or Talgia – apparently the nugget from Talgia broke in half! There are designated fossicking areas within Talgia - keep to the tracks, We recommend you only venture in Talgia if you have 4WD, and depending how far you venture, you may gain a few scratches on the duco.


# Fossicking deed of intent



#### **Durakia State Forest**

Turn **right** out of Hart Hill Camping; go over the causeway veering right at the top of the road and when you get to the T junction, turn left onto Thanes Creek Road. At the T junction turn right onto the Cunningham Hwy. There are a number of access points on your left into Durakia. It is mostly accessible with 2WD unless there has been significant rainfall. It also has designated fossicking areas.

I suggest you let someone know if you are heading into one of the Forests and provide an anticipated time when you would be back – they can be quite a maze and its easy to get lost.
